2023 Budget & Revenue Neutral Rate Facts

Why did I get a notice?

In March 2021, the Kansas Legislature passed Senate Bill 13 (SB13) to establish limitations on ad valorem property tax levies by taxing subdivisions without an addition notice and hearing prior to budget adoptions. This bill repealed the former "Tax Lid" and established the use of the "Revenue Neutral Rate" (RNR).

What is Revenue Neutral Rate?

The Revenue Neutral Rate is the mill levy to generate the exact same amount of property tax revenue as the year before, using the current tax revenue as the year before, using the current tax years total assessed valuation. Taxing subdivisions (cities, schools, rec depts, cemeteries and county) cannot levy above the Revenue Neutral Rate (RNR) without holding RNR Public Hearing for taxpayers to attend and provide feedback.

Do I need to do anything with the notice received?

This notice is **NOT** a bill; it is just for information. The only action to be taken is if you'd like to attend a public hearing regarding adoption of these budgets.

How are my taxes calculated?

For each taxing subdivision, taxes are expressed as mill levy.

Property Assessed Value (x) mill levy rate (/) 1,000 = Property Tax Assessed
